DIFFERENCE BETWEEN INVINCIBLE DEFENCE AND CONVENTIONAL DEFENCE

महर्षि ज्योतिष की दृष्टि में - जुलाई माह

माह जुलाई 2010 का विस्तार विक्रमी संवत् 2067 के आषाढ़ कृष्ण पक्ष की पंचमी तिथि, गुरुवार (जुलाई 1) से श्रावण कृष्ण पक्ष की पंचमी तिथि शनिवार (जुलाई 31) तक रहेगा। जुलाई के प्रारम्भ से 16 जुलाई तक ग्रीष्म ऋतु का काल होगा तत्पश्चात् 17 जुलाई को जब सूर्य भगवान् एक मास के लिए कर्क राशि में प्रवेश करेंगे उसी दिन से वर्षा ऋतु का प्रारम्भ होगा। एक ऋतु की समयावधि दो मास की होती है। इस हिसाब से सूर्य की स्थिति कर्क एवं सिंह राशि में रहने से वर्षा ऋतु होती है, तत्पश्चात् शरद् ऋतु का प्रारम्भ होता है। कर्क संक्रान्ति (कर्क राशि में सूर्य का आगमन) को अयन संक्रान्ति भी कहते हैं। इसी दिन से सूर्य दक्षिणायन हो जाते हैं। कर्क राशि से धनु राशि तक सूर्य के रहने से 6 मास का दक्षिणायन तथा मकर राशि से मिथुन राशि तक सूर्य के रहने से मास तक सूर्य उत्तरायण होते हैं। अयन संक्रान्ति के तीन दिन पहले से तीन दिन बाद तक शुभ कार्य वर्जित है (अयन संक्रान्तेरुमयतस्त्रीणि दिनानि शुभानि विधेयानि) दक्षिणायन को दैत्यों का दिन तथा देवताओं की रात्रि (निरयन याम्यायनं दैत्यानां दिनं देवानां च रात्रिः) कहते हैं। दक्षिणायन सूर्य में (6 मास की अवधि) बहुत से शुभ कार्यों को निषेध किया गया है।

आषाढ़ शुक्ल पक्ष का प्रारम्भ 12 जुलाई सोमवार से है। नानाशास्त्र – पुराणादि में चार नवरात्र का वर्णन है। ये चैत्र आषाढ़ आश्विन और माघ की शुक्ल प्रतिपदा से नवमी तक नौ दिन के होते हैं। जिसमें आषाढ़ और माघ के नवरात्र को गुप्त नवरात्र तथा चैत्र और आश्विन के नवरात्र को प्रकट या प्रसिद्ध नवरात्र कहा जाता है। इस वर्ष आषाढ़ की गुप्त नवरात्र का समय 12 जुलाई सोमवार से 19 जुलाई सोमवार तक है। देवी उपासकों के लिये ये चारों नवरात्र अत्यन्त प्रशस्त माने जाते हैं।

दिनांक 13 जुलाई मंगलवार को (आषाढ़ शुक्ल द्वितीया) को पुष्य नक्षत्र होने से भगवान् जगन्नाथ जी, बलराम जी और सुभद्रा जी को क्रमशः 'नन्दिघोष', 'तालध्वज' एवं 'दर्पदलन' नाम के रथों पर विराजित कर यात्रा करायी जाती है। देश के अनेक भागों में यह 'रथ यात्रा महोत्सव' सम्पन्न होता है। यह 'रथयात्रा महोत्सव' श्री जगन्नाथ पुरी में बहुत विशाल रूप से मनाया जाता है। रथ पर सवार राम, बलराम और सुभद्रा का दर्शन करने वाले पर विपत्ति नहीं आती (रथस्थं ये प्रपश्यन्ति न तेषां जायते विपद्)।

21 जुलाई को स्मार्तो की श्री विष्णु शयनी एकादशी है तथा 22 जुलाई गुरुवार को वैष्णवो की श्री विष्णुशयनी एकादशी व्रत है। इसी दिन रात्रि में मठ-मंदिरों में श्री विष्णुशयनोत्सव मनाया जायगा तथा इसी तिथि से 'चातुर्मास्य व्रत का प्रारम्भ होता है। इस व्रत में साधु-सन्यासी आदि महापुरुष चार मास तक एक ही स्थान पर रुक कर अपनी साधना, अराधना उपासना में तल्लीन रहते हैं, यात्रा नहीं करते।

रविवार 25 जुलाई (आषाढ़ शुक्ल पूर्णिमा) को गुरु परम्परा की सिद्धि के लिये गुरु पूजन का विधान है अतः इस पूर्णिमा को गुरुपूर्णिमा या व्यासपूर्णिमा भी कहते हैं। उसी दिन नारायण, ब्रह्मा, वसिष्ठ, शक्ति, पराशर, व्यास, शुकदेव, गौडपादाचार्य, गोविन्दस्वामी, श्री शंकराचार्य, श्री पद्मपादाचार्य, श्री हस्तामलकाचार्य, श्री त्रोटकाचार्य एवं श्री सुरेश्वराचार्य का क्रम से पूजन करते हुए गुरुवर श्री ब्रह्मानन्द सरस्वती तथा पूज्य श्री महेश योगी जी का पूजन (गुरुपरम्परा पूजन) सबको करना चाहिए।

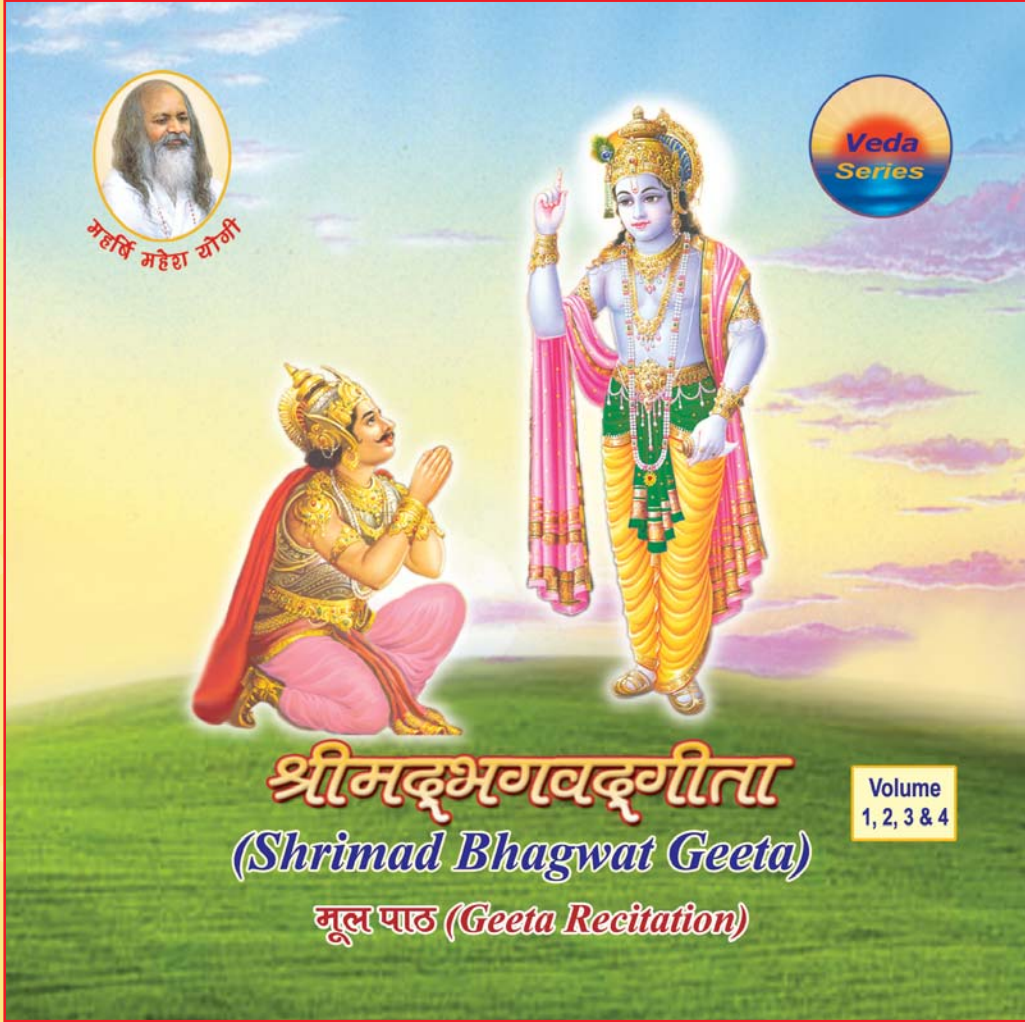

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NATIONAL LEVEL TALENTED TEACHERS SEARCH COMPETITION

Hon'ble Chairman expressed the desire to conduct an exam at all India level of teachers to search for talented teachers. This exam will be in two categories:

Category One – PGT all subject/TGT all subject/PRT

Category Two – Vedic Science Common Exam (Compulsory for all teachers)

Category One exam will be conducted on subject knowledge of the teacher as per his/her appointment in the Institution. For this exam question papers will be prepared at National Level and exam will be conducted at all centres on the same day and same time. For this, Board has selected the following centres as examination centre i.e. Noida, Lucknow, Allahabad, Jabalpur, Bhopal, Raipur, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Chennai, Dehradun, Almora, Bhubneshwar and Kurukshetra. This is with a view that the participants cover the minimum distance and can attend the exam by coming through school transport and return the same day. For appearing in this exam teachers will be provided lunch, transport/second class train fare wherever required.

Prizes of this exam decided are as under:

For Category One:-

The papers will be based on NCER T/MVM syllabus and cover the knowledge based on should know, could know and must know. Minimum desired entries will be 20, Minimum achieved percentage will be 75% and Top Two participants will be awarded with Cash Prize as follows:

PGT (each subject) – Rs. 51000/- for first rank, Rs. 25500/- for second rank

TGT (subject as per post – the candidates will be required to attempt two subject out of three) – Rs. 41000/- for first rank and 21000/- for second rank.

PRT – Exam will in two subject separately for Science and Art Graduates, Prize money will be Rs. 31000/- for first rank and Rs. 15500/- for second rank for both the categories.

MAHARISHI VEDIC SCIENCE COMPETITION

Prize money for Maharishi Vedic Science Examination (teachers category) will be Rs. 1,00,000/- for first rank and Rs. 51000/- for second rank and for non-teaching category it will be Rs. 51000/- and 25500/- respectively.

Vedic Science paper will have the option of Hindi/English Language. However, subject paper will be in English language only.

IIMS, PROMETRIC GEAR UP FOR GLITCH-FREE CAT 2010

Having burnt their fingers with the computer-based Common Admission Test in 2009, the Indian Institutes of Management and Prometric — the US-based firm which has been assigned the task of conducting the exam — have proposed a few changes to ensure this year's exam is conducted without any technical glitches.

These include a longer testing window to provide candidates with more choices, a longer test-site preparation period, an improved technology for both registration and delivery, and fewer sites (online centers) to ensure a better test experience for the candidates.

According to them, the reduction in sites will not compromise the nationwide reach and availability of the test.

“We are taking every possible step to ensure a successful administration for CAT 2010 candidates. To avert potential overlaps in schedule with college exams, Prometric has recommended an earlier testing period. The final dates and details on registration and scheduling will be announced officially by the IIMs,” Prometric India [Images] MD Soumitra Roy said.

CAT, mandatory for those who wish to study at IIMs and over 150 other B-schools, faced flak from various quarters last year after its new computer-based version was marred by a series of technical glitches, followed by a retest and delayed results.

To avoid a similar ‘failure’ this year, Prometric has reviewed all the processes and technology employed during CAT 2009, including the protocols that ensured a successful administration during the final days of testing.

The US software firm has also reviewed the performance of the sites used during the CAT 2009, partners and, most importantly, feedback from the candidates.

The CAT 2010 programme claims to incorporate information from the comprehensive audit that was conducted after the CAT 2009.

“We are currently finalising the list of local technology partners who will work with us in the areas of site readiness, test administration and on-site technical support,” said Roy.

This year, the computer-based CAT will be conducted by IIM Lucknow [Images] and IIM Calcutta. In 2009, it was conducted by IIM

Ahmadabad [Images] and IIM Bangalore. Himanshu Rai, chairperson (admissions) of IIM Lucknow, will take over as the CAT convener from Satish Deodhar, who was convener last year.

“COUNTRY NEEDS TO EXPAND ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION”

To combat the shortage of trained manpower, the country needs to expand access to higher education and skill development using information technology tools, said A. Kalanidhi, vice-chairman, Commonwealth Science and Technology Academy for Research (C-STAR), here on Wednesday.

Delivering the Prof. Y. Nayudamma Memorial Lecture on the “Prospects of Technology Education in India,” Dr. Kalanidhi, former vice-chancellor of Anna University, Chennai, said India had sufficient manpower resources and talent. But large sections of society had been excluded from the ambit of higher education. “If sufficient importance is given to these aspects, in five years we can say that the sun does not set in India’s HR Empire,” he said.

While the inclusion of private players in the sector had helped, there was also some “sluggishness” on the part of the policymakers. The use of information technology tools in teaching and skill training had largely been ignored even though India was globally recognised as an IT hub, he said.

Dr. Kalanidhi said he was shocked recently when the principal of an engineering college had said he did not have an email id.

“Vice-Chancellors are often chosen from this pool of principals. It is no wonder that over 70 per cent of them in the country are not IT-savvy. The other 30 per cent of the universities do not have vice-chancellors,” he quipped.

The Union government was now working on the restructuring of higher education in the country and at this juncture it would be useful to remember Dr. Nayudamma, who had shown vision in the moulding of science and technological research in the country, he said.

A.B. Mandal, director, Central Leather Research Institute (CLRI), said the memorial lecture was being organised by the Nayudamma Science Foundation (NSF), CLRI, and the Nayudamma Memorial Science Foundation (NMSF), each year to honour the memory of the former CLRI Director and CSIR Director-general.

K.S. Jayaraman, retired scientist, CLRI, provided a brief profile of Dr. Nayudamma’s achievements, and D. Chandramouli, scientist, CLRI, delivered the vote of thanks.

INDIA RANKS LOW IN RESEARCH

India is ranked a poor 35th among the top 40 nations in the research performance, as per the Journal Citation Report released by Thomson Reuters, which is considered to be a leading source of intelligent information.

87,512 papers

Out of the 1,62,100 papers submitted from 2004-2009 to leading journals by Indian researchers only 87,512 were cited by peers, the report reveals.

Based on the citations by researchers across the world India stands at 35th position with 53.99 per cent of papers cited while the top place is taken by Denmark with 74.45 per cent citations.

Countries that submitted more than 20,000 papers were considered for the purpose.

Denmark top

“The report analyses the performance of world’s most highly cited, peer reviewed journals from 2,200 publishers in 78 countries,” said the Thomson Reuters in its media release.

Denmark, ranked first saw 74.45 per cent of its 2005-09 papers receive at least one citation.

This was 17 per cent above the world average. Switzerland, the Netherlands, Sweden and Scotland were ranked second to fifth.

USA 8th

The USA was placed 8th while China was in the 33rd position.

The countries were placed based on the impact of research and there too India is in the 35th place. Switzerland takes the first place in the impact of research category.

The citation impact is calculated based on percentage of papers cited and citations per paper.

In research circles, if a paper is cited by a peer it is an indication of the excellence of the research.

‘No indicator’

Though agreeing that quality of Indian research is declining as whole due to various factors, academics say such reports are no indicators of a country’s performance since they adopt different parameters. “Some qualitative

research done in India might be useful for developing nations and may not be cited by researchers in the developed nations,” says K.C. Reddy, Chairman of APSCHE.

But he agrees that quality research is on decline in India though a few organisations and individuals are involved in excellent research.

10 COMMUNITY COLLEGES PLANNED TO CATER FOR UNSKILLED LABOURERS

The University of Madras and Chennai Corporation will jointly set up Community Colleges for unskilled labourers in Chennai district, said G. Thiruvassagam, Vice-Chancellor, Madras University here on Monday.

Talking to reporters Prof. Thiruvassagam said the Chennai Mayor M. Subramanian has agreed to help in identifying locations for the institutions. The Vice-Chancellor also has plans to rope in the help of Indian Bank for installing equipment in these colleges, he said.

A total of 10 such institutions would be started in three districts. In Chennai it will be four Community Colleges and three each in Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur districts, he said. No educational qualification was needed for those wish to join these colleges, where training would be provided on trades such as two-wheeler mechanics, air-conditioning and refrigeration and masonry. Those who wish to join should know to read and write.

The objective of the college is to improve their skills and provide them with theoretical knowledge. Duration of the course is six months and in each batch 100 persons would be admitted in one College.

In a year nearly 800 persons would pass out of the college in Chennai alone, he said.

The Department of Technical Education has identified 25 trades, which would be offered and they will issue the certificates at the end of the course period. The class timings would be during evening hours and weekends to suit the needs of semi-skilled/skilled labourers, he said.

Free Education Scheme 2010-11

A total of 28 students from 25 different departments of the Madras University who have been selected to receive Free Education Scheme of the University would be completing their first semester, he said. Explaining about the selection of students to receive this benefit, Prof. Thiruvassagam said those who live in Chennai, Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur districts are only eligible to apply for this scheme. They should possess a ration card and their economic status and merits would be considered during the selection process. First generation students, widows, landless and homeless boys would be given priority, he said.

The last date for applying for this scheme is July 10. A total of 110 Colleges were functioning under the Madras University and each College should admit at least 10 students under this scheme, Prof. Thiruvassagam added.

NEW FORMAT FOR GMAT EXAMS

MUMBAI: The Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT), a computer-based exam that has for long been the gateway to top B-schools across the world, is all set for a revamp. This will be the tenth avatar of GMAT, an exam created over half a century ago. The Next Generation GMAT will be introduced in June 2012. The pilot test will be conducted later this year.

One of the most significant changes in the test involves the addition of a new section, called Integrated Reasoning. “We have designed the new section in consultation with B-school faculty across the world. In addition to the verbal skills and quantitative analysis, the new section will test a candidate’s ability to evaluate information from multiple sources and solve complex problems as well as the ability to listen to complex spoken material and form judgments over what statements would strengthen or weaken an argument,” Ashok Sarathy,

vice-president, GMAT Program, told TOI from the US. This means that GMAT-takers will now wear headphones while writing the exam.

According to Sarathy, the new section will test students on how they assimilate data from multiple sources. For instance, candidates will have to read passages, graphs as well as tables and spreadsheets in order to ferret out bits of information from each to answer a question. "Integrated reasoning is a microcosm of what candidates will see in a classroom and later on, in the business world," added Sarathy.

The Graduate Management Admission Council, the body that conducts GMAT, decided to introduce new section after surveying B-schools across the world in last four years. The overall length of the exam won't increase and will remain three and a half hours. Integrated reasoning will be a 30-minute-long section that will replace one of the two essays that are part of GMAT's analytical writing section. There will be no changes in verbal and quantitative sections, and exam will be scored using the existing scale.

WORLD HAS GREAT HOPE FROM INDIA, CHINA

As world leaders are arriving in Toronto for the G8 and G20 summits, which get underway from Saturday with focus on economic recovery and global development, the world has great hope from India [Images] and China.

India would renew its push for reforms at international financial institutions like the IMF, which would give it and other emerging economies a greater voting share and oppose a single global bank levy designed to insure against failing institutions, an IMF proposal backed by Germany [Images] and France [Images] at the G20 Summit.

The world, however, is expecting more from India. Given that most developed economies are fragile, there's high respect for the two big economies that are actually growing - India and China where growth seems robust.

Given its current economic advantage, Dr Bhausaheb Ubale, a noted economist, say this year's G20 may present an opportunity for India to position itself as a global leader.

Prime Minister Manmohan Singh [Images] will arrive in Toronto on June 26 for G20 Summit where he will hold talks with his Canadian counterpart Stephen Harper and sign a bilateral civil nuclear cooperation agreement that would allow India to secure uranium, nuclear equipment and technology to meet its energy needs.

Both leaders would also hold talks on a host of bilateral, regional and multilateral issues, officials said.

Apart from cooperation in civil nuclear energy, both countries expected to sign a MOU for cooperation in mining, a MOU for cooperation in higher education, a MOU for cooperation in culture and a social security agreement, official sources said.

Singh's delegation will include the Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission Montek Singh Ahluwalia [Images], who is the G20 Sherpa from India.

In addition, there will be other senior officials attending as part of prime minister's delegation including the National Security Advisor Shiv Shankar Menon [Images] and Foreign Secretary Nirupama Rao [Images].

Canada [Images] has also invited Spain, Netherlands, Malawi (as chair of the African Union), Ethiopia (which holds the chair of NEPAD), and Vietnam (as the chair country of ASEAN), to the G20 Summit.

In addition, the Secretary General of the United Nations, the president of the World Bank, the managing director of the IMF, the director general of the WTO, heads of the ILO, the Financial Stability Board, etc., are likely to be present.

The prime minister will arrive in Toronto on June 26th and has a very busy schedule. The G20 Summit starts with an official welcome and reception followed by working dinner by the Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper which would be attended by over 400 dignitaries.

DIABETES CASE RAISE RISK OF LIVER DISEASE: STUDY

It's well-known that diabetes increases the risk of vision loss and kidney failure, but a new study has claimed that it could also lead to serious liver disease.

The research, published in Canadian Medical Association Journal, suggested that people newly diagnosed with diabetes have an elevated risk of developing serious liver disease, including cirrhosis or liver failure.

The study carried out by researchers from St Michael's Hospital, University of Toronto and the Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences in Toronto found that those with newly diagnosed diabetics appear to have a 77 per cent greater risk of developing a serious liver condition than non-diabetics.

For their 13-year-long study, the researchers looked at 4,38,069 adults aged 30 to 75 years with newly diagnosed diabetes.

They compared them with a group of 2,059,709 people without diabetes and found an incidence rate of 8 per 10,000 person-years for serious liver disease in people with newly diagnosed diabetes compared to a rate of 4 per 10,000 person years among non-diabetic controls.

They noted that persons with diabetes and concomitant obesity or hypertension had the highest risk of liver disease.

"We posit that the presence of overt diabetes reflects more severe insulin resistance, a greater fatty load in the liver and potentially worse hepatic inflammation and injury," wrote study authors Joel Ray and Gillian Booth of St Michael's Hospital.

"Those who have diabetes may not just have higher blood sugars, but greater long-term insulin resistance and fatty load to the liver, which ultimately impacts on the integrity of the liver's cells," the authors said.

A previous study by the US Department of Veterans Affairs found that the incidence of serious liver disease was two times higher in people with diabetes, although the study sample comprised older men in hospital.

The authors suggested that the effects of weight loss and glycemic and lipid control should be better understood before instituting annual screening for liver disease.
